

This training session is intended for a group of 6 participants maximum. Any person who wishes to become a driving assessor/ coach

Prerequisites

- Valid driver's license, held for at least five years, matching the type of vehicle and country concerned.
- International driver's license (if training is to be delivered outside the country of residence).
- Fluency in the language in which the training is provided.
- Adequate level of educational attainment and computer skills.

Objectives

- To teach the participant basic pedagogical approaches.
- To master the defensive driving rules and recognize mechanical skill when driving.
- To enable the participant effectively assess other drivers' driving capabilities.
- To enable the participant to identify other drivers' strengths and weaknesses.

Content

Day 1

Theoretical presentation of the five rules/ themes of driving. Introduction to the drive train.

Presentation of the principles of teaching and communication for adults.

Presentation of multiple scenarios (classroom role-play).

Application to real-life situations.

Day 2

Themed practical driving with intervention and coaching (Themes 1 and 2).

Theme 1: Presentation of Driving Rules and Vision Models for safe driving.

Man and Machine reaction times.

Theme 2: Vision: binocular vision and peripheral vision - Notion of distance and speed.

Vertical/horizontal field of view, Information analysis.

Day 3

Themed practical driving with intervention and coaching (Themes 3 and 4).

Theme 3: Anticipation: the various sources of risk and corrective actions.

Theme 4: Safe distance to be maintained:

vehicle in motion, vehicle at rest, Unfavorable driving conditions.

Day 4

Themed practical driving with intervention and coaching (Theme 5).

Themed practical driving with intervention and coaching (Themes 1 to 5).

Theme 5: Expertise: driver's skills and knowledge, physical and mental proficiency.

Driver behavior.

Day 5

Themed practical driving with intervention and coaching (Themes 1 to 5).

Afternoon: Student assessment/Round-table discussion.

Assessment

He/she will be evaluated on the basis of their performance on the theoretical and practical elements.

Theme 1: Presentation of Driving Rules and Vision Models for SAFE driving Man and Machine reaction times.

Theme 2: Vision: binocular vision and peripheral vision - Notion of distance and speed Vertical/horizontal field of view, Analysis of information.
